

World Book Day-Friday, 3rd March


2017'S £1 BOOKS





















This year St Bernadette's will be celebrating World Book Day and our love of books on Friday 3rd March.

The children should come to school dressed in their school uniform as usual.

Each class will be focusing on an engaging and stimulating book and will be carrying out activities linked to that text all day. You are invited to join in on the day with...

breakfast with a book - come in from 8.30am for a light breakfast and share a book with your child in their classroom.

Secret Reader - surprise your child by coming into school to read one of your favourite stories. Please let your child's class teacher know if you are able to come in.

book Sale - We are asking for donations of good quality books to come into school. Children will have the opportunity to browse these books and buy a new one for 20p. Monies raised will go towards new books for the school.

Attendance Matters

Holidays in Term Time

We do not encourage term time holidays as we want children in school as much as possibly. However, if you decide to take your child out of school for a family holiday you must complete a "Leave of Absence" request form which are available from the school office or on our website at http://www.st-

bernadettesprimary.co.uk/attachments/download.asp?file=35&type=pdf

The Department for Education states that Headteachers are no longer able to authorise holidays unless there are "exceptional circumstances" and state clearly that a family holiday is not classed as an exceptional circumstance.

Where a family decide to take a holiday during term time the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. In the past, the Local Authority would issue a penalty warning notice (fine) if a child had more than 10 sessions of unauthorised absences (2 sessions = 1 day). At the moment, following the recent High Court ruling, the Local Authority are only issuing fines if a child has more than 10% unauthorised absences. As you may know the case has now gone to the Supreme Court and a judgement is expected soon.

We were really shocked when we saw these figures in the table below, if your child has 85% attendance over the year, this means they have missed 145 lessons, making it a huge,

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Attendance during one	Days absent	Number of missed lessons
95%	9 days	45 Lessons
90%	19 days	95 lessons
85%	29 days	145 lessons
80%	38 days	190 lessons


Gates.


