Tax-Free Child Care...

Tax-Free Childcare is coming soon - so sign up today!

We invited you to sign up for Tax-Free Childcare, but you don't appear to have done so yet. Tax-Free Childcare will start to rollout to parents very soon and over 20,000 childcare providers have already signed up - so don't miss out and sign up now! If you've signed up in the last month you don't need to take any action.

To sign up now go to www.childcare-support.tax.service.gov.uk.

To sign up you'll need:

- your user ID 50004320794
- your bank account details (the account which you want childcare payments to be paid to), and either
- your business 10 digit Unique Taxpayer Reference (UTR) and the postcode this is linked to (e.g. business address, personal address, registered office). You can find these on previous tax returns or other communications from HM Revenue and Customs; or
- your National Insurance number, if you're a nanny and don't have a UTR.

Remind me, what is Tax-Free Childcare?

Tax-Free Childcare is a new online government service to help working parents with the cost of their childcare. For every £8 a parent pays into their childcare account, we'll pay in an extra £2, up to a maximum of £2,000 every year for each child. Parents will then be able to pay you for childcare directly from their childcare accounts.

It's important you sign up so parents can use Tax-Free Childcare

Parents can only pay you from their childcare account if you've signed up to Tax-Free Childcare. Once you've signed up, you won't need to do anything else. Parents will be able to use the online service to select you as their childcare provider and make payments directly into your bank account. So your 'parents' may soon start asking you whether you're ready for Tax-Free Childcare.

We're also about to launch our 'Childcare Provider Checker', www.childcare-provider-checker.tax.service.gov.uk which allows parents to check which childcare providers have signed up for Tax-Free Childcare.

If you're a registered charity and don't have a UTR please phone our helpline on 0300 123 4097 and we'll tell you how to sign up.

It's important you sign up yourself rather than asking someone to do it for you, as you need to set your own security questions. If you want to nominate someone to help manage your childcare account in future, you'll have the opportunity to do this when you sign up.

How is Tax-Free Childcare different to Childcare Vouchers?

Tax-Free Childcare will eventually replace the current childcare voucher scheme, and it will be available to many more parents. You'll still be able to receive payments from parents using childcare vouchers once you have signed up to Tax-Free Childcare, although families will not be able to use both at the same time.

To check you have all the information and to make sure you are ready for the launch of Tax-Free Childcare, go to www.childcare-support.tax.service.gov.uk/moreinfoccp to find out more.

30 Hours Free Childcare

The government will also be launching the 30 hours free childcare offer in September 2017. Working parents of 3 and 4-year-old children in England may be entitled to an extra 15 hours a week of free early education or childcare (on top of the universal 15 hour entitlement). Parents will be able to apply for Tax-Free Childcare and 30 hours free childcare at the same time, through a single online service.
