On Wednesday of next week, the school photographer will be visiting. Look out for a parentmail with information of what is happening very soon!



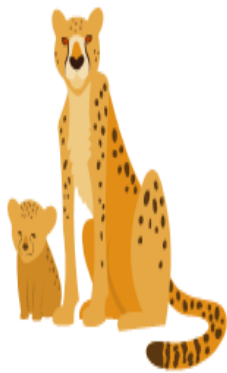
Living the Gospel

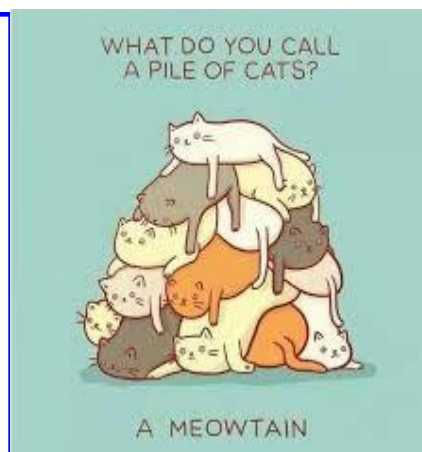

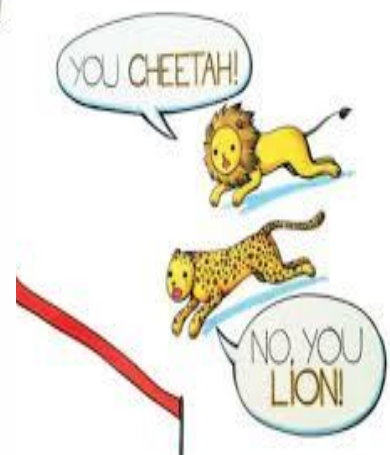
