Last night at science club we made ice cream and the children requested that we share it on the blog.

First we mixed 125ml whole milk with 20g caster sugar and added a few drops of vanilla essence (you could add chocolate chips). Then, pour the mixture into a bag, squeeze out the air and fasten securely with a clip. Place this bag into a second bag, squeezing out any air and secure it.





You need a container with a lid, fill this 1/3 with ice and sprinkle with salt. Put the bag of ice cream mixture in the middle of the jar and surround with ice and sprinkle with salt. Next cover the top of the bag with ice and sprinkle with salt. For the next 10-15 minutes shake and roll the jar. Then tip out any water, pack more ice around the bag and continue shaking for approximately 10 minutes. Finally enjoy your ice cream!


### Year 6 visit the Cathedral

## Things to do...Places to go this summer!





Our local library staff have been telling the children how to take part in Animal Agents, this year's Summer Reading Challenge.

The children will tell you all about it! All they have to do is read SIX library books and visit the library regularly over the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives along the way.

Please encourage your children to visit the library and sign up and see the difference the Summer Reading Challenge makes to their reading.

Don't forget, Animal Agents has a dedicated website for children taking part in the Challenge.

As well as keeping track of their progress online, kids can have all kinds of fun here! There are game and competitions, children can send messages and even find out what to read next using the Book Sorter.

#### Meeting All Children's Needs

At the heart of the Challenge is children choosing and sharing any books - in any format - that they like. If your child is visually impaired or finds printed books tricky your library may be able to help suggest alternatives. The free RNIB Library Service (which covers Braille, Giant Print and Talking Books) can be used to borrow books for the Summe Reading Challenge and throughout the year, and most libraries can help you with this.
