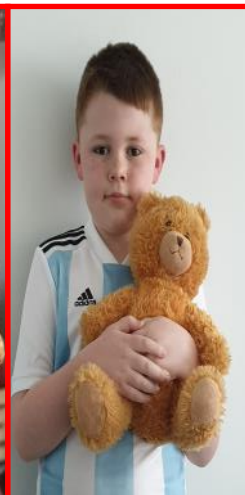

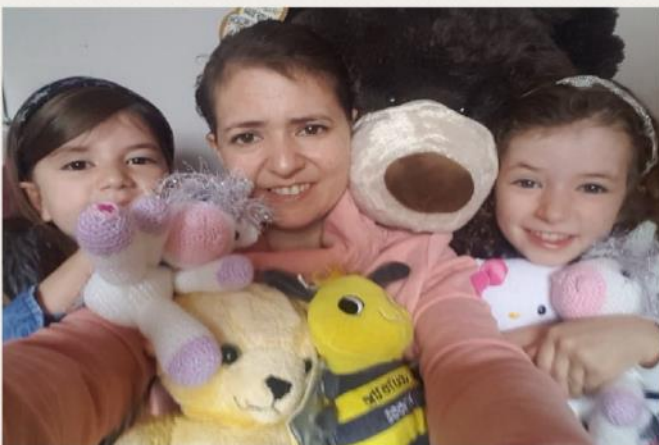

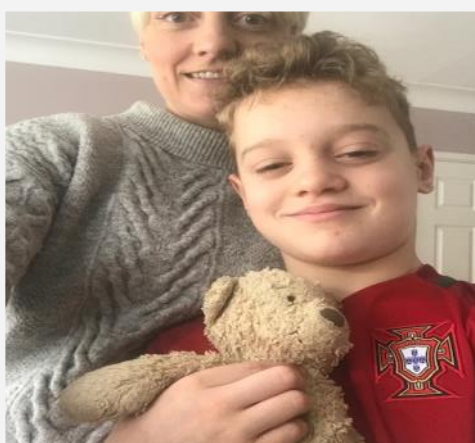

Charlie baked this amazing loaf of bread! Warburtons will be worried! Congratulations! (I just want to know where you managed to get the flour!)



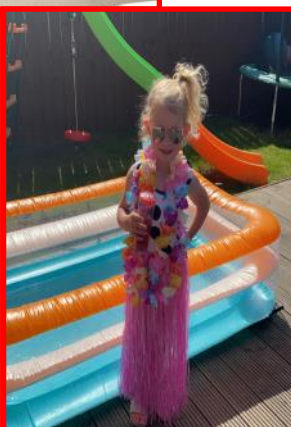
Congratulations to Ollie and Sebby on their kickboxing purple belt grading. Ollie has also been promoted to the junior team! We are all very proud of you boys!!

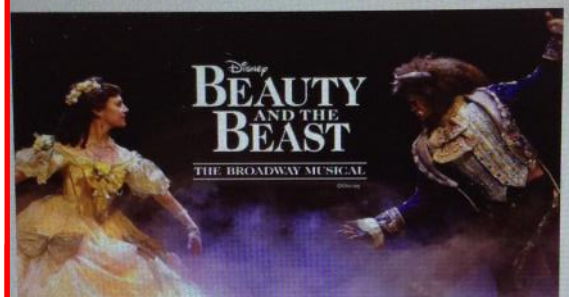

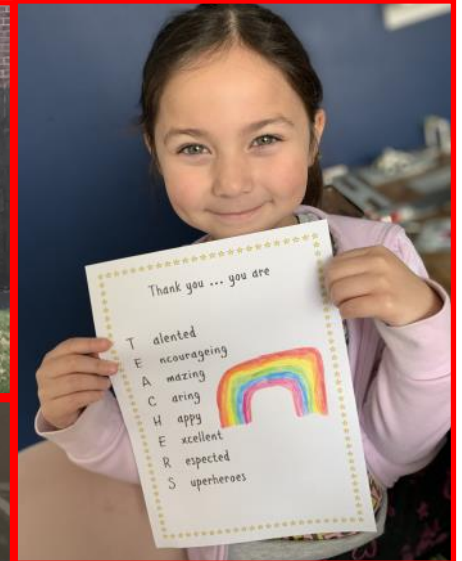

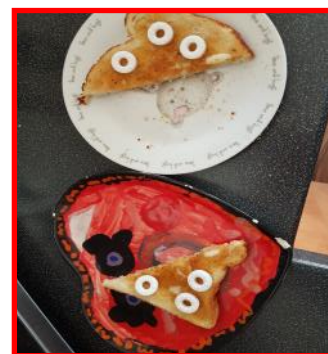
