## Bernadette's Blog

Dear children,

As we reach the end of another very busy term, I would like to congratulate you all on your amazing achievements so far this year; your hard work and commitment to learning has been reflected in your end of term reports, your gifts and talents shared on our weekly blog and demonstrated beautifully in our recent nativity performances. This term, as you have settled into your new classes, we have watched you progress through the curriculum and grow in confidence but we have also watched you grow spiritually.

We started the term with a whole school liturgy and shared the story of the Lampedusa cross; a cross made from pieces of a boat that was wrecked on 11 October 2013, off the coast of Lampedusa, in which 311 refugees were drowned en-route from Libya to Europe. We told you of the remarkable way, Mr Tuccio, the island's carpenter, used his skills and talents to make each of the survivors a cross from the wreckage as symbol of HOPE for the future.

You listened, you showed understanding and compassion to the refugee crisis and then, as you do, you went into action! You took the idea of spreading HOPE and using a symbol to do this and, in a way only the children of St. Bernadette's could, you turned it into something magical. It has been an absolute privilege for all of the staff to watch how you have risen brilliantly to the challenge – both in school, in our community, nationally AND internationally! Your kindness, generosity and big hearts have touched many, many people. In fact, as I write this message, over 19,000 people have seen your mission in action across the world. And we couldn't be prouder of each and every one of you.

We have enjoyed reading messages from around the globe as those who have found the bags of HOPE or have been given them have had a small insight into what we have the joy of seeing every day in school—the pupils of St. Bernadette's putting their faith into action and really trying to live our school's vision statement. Well done to you all!

To all parents, carers and our wonderful PTA, 'Thank you' doesn't seem enough to express how much we appreciate everything you do for our school community. It has been a very busy term in school but we do recognise how busy it has been for families too with

curriculum evenings, parents evenings, 'stay and play' days, fairs to organsie and attend, nativities and many other events held in school. Your support makes everything so much more special for the children and all funds raised at school events go straight back into the 'pot' to provide our children with a wealth of additional experiences and trips. Your on-going contributions, comments and generosity of time and donations have been overwhelming - thank you!

So, on behalf of the Governors and all of the staff, I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year.










## Our Hope Project Update!


