#### Literacy

This term the children will be training to become athletes. Athletes do not just need to be fit and healthy they also need to be knowledgeable and show respect to others.

We will be researching Brazil and The Amazon Rainforest, reporting our findings in a non-chronological report. We will be looking at The Vanishing Rainforest, a story set in The Amazon and use this as inspiration to write poetry around this. We will also use this to create our own narrative.

The skills we will be focusing on are:

Using an increasing range of sentence structures Fronted adverbials

Conjunctions to express time and cause Direct speech and inverted commas

Composing and rehearsing sentences orally Vocabulary

Assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' work

### Reading

We will be reading a variety of non-fiction and information texts, poems and songs and stories from other cultures (mainly Brazil).

This half term the skills we will focus on will be:
Recognising some different forms of poetry
Inferring Characters' feelings from their actions
Commenting on authors use of words & the effect on
the reader

Identifying themes and conventions
Retrieve and record information from non-fiction

#### R.E.

We will complete our work on Reconciliation. We will be exploring the importance of the mosque in our multi-faith week and will be completing our final RE topic on the Universal Church- Special Places using many of the Cafod site resources.



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#### Science Sound

Identifying how sounds are made
Recognise that vibrations from sound travel through
a medium to the ear

Find patterns between the pitch of a sound to the features of the object that made the sound
Find patterns between the volume of the sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it
Recognise the sounds get fainted the further as the distance from the sound source increases

We will be investigating sound using the djembe drums.

## Key Value Respect

#### Maths

Work in maths will be Olympic and Brazil themed where possible, we will be completing work on time and fractions. The objectives we will focus on will be:

Tell and write the time from an analogue clock, including using Roman numerals from I to XII, and 12-hour and 24-hour clocks

Estimate and read time with increasing accuracy to the nearest minute; record and compare time in terms of seconds, minutes and hours

Use vocabulary such as o'clock, a.m./p.m., morning, afternoon, noon and midnight

Know the number of seconds in a minute and the number of days in each month, year and leap year

Recognise and show, using diagrams, equivalent fractions with small denominators

Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole [for example, 7.5 + 7.1 = 7.6] Compare and order unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominators

# Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG) will be taught within literacy lessons and straight after lunch as a quick fire activity. Skills covered will be—Homophones and near homophones
Revision of non negotiable words

Revision of key letter strings taught throughout the year

### History / Geography

We will be studying the history of the Olympics beginning with the ancient Greek Olympics. We will be constructing a timeline to place events in order; and will be using this to help understand the changes and impacts the Olympics have had and how these influences have shaped Britain and influenced the wider world.

#### Art / DT

We will start off our Olympic unit of work looking at the Brazilian pop artist Romerro Britto.

We will be looking at colour combinations and the effects these have on artists' work and using mixed media to create and construct Rio carnival masks. We will also be studying a healthy diet and will be creating a health drink for an athlete.

#### P.E.

P.E. will be a mixture of athletics and rounders. In athletics, children will be taught skills such as running styles and skills used in long jump. In rounders we will be learning the rules and looking at working strategically as a team. We will be teaching skills in striking and fielding.

#### **PSHCE**

Our key value this term will be Respect. This links in many ways to the European elections as well as respecting other nationalities and differences between people. It will also fit in with our work on Islam that will be covered in R.E.
