

Literacy

This half term the children will be using empathy and compassion in studying poems, photographs and videos to develop an appreciation for the significance of Remembrance. Pupils will be writing their own poems about poppies and letters from the trenches.

Following this, the class will be using the picture book 'The Arrival' by fantastic illustrator and author, Shaun Tan. This book will be the basis of much of our writing, including writing our own narrative and creating a balanced discussion text. These 2 very different genres will allow us to look at and compare different writing styles.

Pupils will be writing their own story to interpret the detailed images in Tan's book, concentrating on maintaining a stance and opinion whilst ensuring a clear and concise structure. Furthermore, we will be considering the book in relation to the current refugee crisis and proposing and discussing balanced arguments for and against.

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
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Our topic leading up to Advent is Commitment. The children will be studying the calling some individuals feel when drawn to a particular vocation. We will examine this further as we study the ordination of a priest and the commitment with involves.

Reading

The children will be taught reading through literacy lessons and daily focussed reading sessions. They will be taught the skills of comprehension, inference, text structure and organisation, language and themes using a variety of text styles and genres.

Maths

Following a half term focusing larghely on calculation, we will be looking to embed this acquired knowledge over the next few weeks by applying it to fractions, decimals and percentages problems. We will be investigating concepts such as equivalenace, simplifying and adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions.

In the run up the Christmas we will also be studying some geometry, investigating and solving problems involving shape. This will include looking at new elements to the year 6 curriculum such as circumference, radius and diameter of circles and the volume of 3D shapes.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Through literacy, basic skills and stand alone grammar lessons, year 6 will be considering a number of new technical erms when it comes to grammar. We will also be working on our spelling, including common spelling patters likely to appear in their SATs.

History/ Geography

This half term, pupils in year 6 will be completing a study of the Shang Dynasty. They will be making and writing of clay 'bones' and looking at the significant differences in culture of this period in history.

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Art / DT

Initially, the pupils in year 6 will be looking at Remembrance Day art with textiles and creating clay poppies to tie in with our literacy work.

Following this, the children will be creating a range of works of art based on our history topic of the Shang Dynasty. Pupils will be using a range of mediums to experiment with Chinese writing and pictures. This will include making their own clay bones and etching Chinese writing into them, as was done during the Shang Dynasty.
