Behaviour Policy Amendments June 2020

To ensure government guidance on social distancing is adhered to by our whole school community, it has been necessary to add a number of additional expectations into our behaviour policy in order to maintain the highest standard of behaviour, health and safety of our whole school community during the Coronavirus Pandemic.

The guidance set out below must be read by all parents / carers and pupils. By making the decision to send your child back to school, you are agreeing to uphold and follow all criteria as set out in the guidance below.

The site:

- Only one parent / carer is permitted to drop off/pick up their children adhering to all school advice and new timings of the school day.
- Arrival and departure times are staggered and therefore it is important you depart the site promptly in order to reduce the volume of parents accessing the site at any given time.
- Parents must not congregate on the school site or the surrounding area. Failure to adhere to social distancing guidance whilst on the school site may result in a parent being asked not to enter the site as this could compromise the safety of other parents, staff and pupils.
- There are 2m social distance markings on the pathway and entry to Reception. Please ensure you use these markings in order to maintain a safe distance when lining up to drop off/collect. Do not allow younger siblings to run through the markings.
- There are 2m areas clearly labelled outside classroom doors – please do not enter them when dropping off/picking up to allow safe social distancing for staff.
- Where other areas of the site have not been marked, please use good judgement to maintain safe social distancing so as not to compromise the health and safety of others.
- Once children are dismissed, parents are wholly responsible for ensuring their child adheres to social distancing guidance as set out by the government and school policy.
- Children must not play on equipment on school grounds.
- Parents and carers are not permitted to enter the school building (including the entrance porch) without an agreed appointment.
- Verbally reinforce the guidelines regularly with your child. Ensure that any adult other than yourself who is dropping off/collecting your child is familiar with the guidelines.

- Seesaw can be used to communicate with class teachers on pupils learning. All other concerns must be communicated via the school office. All matters will initially be recorded by Mrs Julie Royle who will direct the concern to the relevant member of staff.
- Support your school through this difficult time. If you have a concern, please raise it with school rather than on the school yard or social media. Your child's safety, the safety of our staff and our community is paramount to us. If you feel that is being compromised in anyway, tell us!

School Ready

The whole experience will be very different for pupils and it is important they are prepared for the day ahead.

- Although uniform is not required during this final term, all children **MUST** arrive at school in clean clothing every day. Clothing should be washed when they return home at the end of a school day in order to keep your household as safe as possible.
- Coats will be kept in the classroom and therefore must be kept clean and free from any old tissues, rubbish or toys in the pocket.
- It will be extremely important for all children to spend time outside each day. Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for all weather e.g. an outdoor coat with a hood that is suitable for playing out in even when it is raining, all day sun cream applied before the start of the day and a sun hat.
- All children must bring a water bottle to school – no cups will be provided. Water bottles will be refilled from classrooms, where possible.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- Large bags including backpacks, sports bags and handbags will not be permitted in school.
- All equipment will be supplied to children individually to avoid any transmission of the virus between resources therefore, children must not bring any stationary, books or toys from home into school. This also includes cakes, sweets etc.... for birthday celebrations.
- As all pupils, including Year 6, must be dropped off and collected from school, mobile phones must not be brought into school.

There will be occasion where a child may need to bring a bag if they are travelling between parents' homes. In this instance, please inform us via the school office in advance if your child needs to bring an overnight bag into school so we can arrange for the safe storage of the bag throughout the school day.

Movement Inside and Outside of School

This list gives examples of how pupils will move around school. It is not exhaustive and there will be a very small number of exceptions depending on individual need.

- All pupils must, where possible, adhere to the social distancing rules of two metres that are in place inside and outside of the building. Markings around the site for drop off and collection will support this.
- Each pod will explain in full how they would like the children to enter / leave the building for breaks – pupils must adhere to these instructions.

- Pupil movement around school will be limited. They will be given very clear instructions on where they can and cannot move. Staff will be on hand to support this initially.
- Pupils will be shown the boundaries of their pod and are expected to adhere to all social distancing restrictions.
- Pupils will be given their own equipment and stationary which staff will wash at the end of each day. Equipment must not be shared with other pupils.

We fully understand that there will be a period of adjustment for all staff, pupils and parents. As such, we will do everything we can to support the smooth transition for all into this 'new normal.' However, where we believe that despite support and reminders to adhere to all of the guidance set out, we reserve the right to remove access to school for anyone we believe is more than able to but is choosing not to follow the guidance set out by government and school.
