"A hug" said Pooh, "is always the right size."

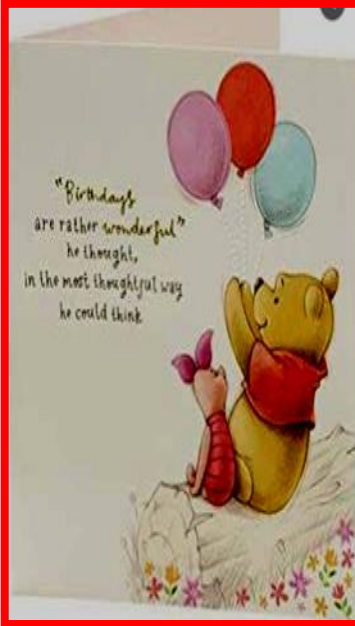
