English

Year 6 will spend the first part of the half term working with a grammar focus. We will create detailed character descriptions ensuring that we have used a variety of different clauses and phrases in our writing. We will also work on creating scripts for movie trailers with a focus on using a range of different tense types.

We will then move on to looking at language and synonyms and antonyms to help expand our vocabulary. This will be done through readings and alone grammar and literacy lessons and sharing a class text.

SPaG

Grammar will be taught in 2 ways. Firstly, through daily literacy lessons, where grammar will be highlighted through reading and used in the application of writing. Secondly through stand alone weekly grammar lessons, where skills from Literacy lessons will be consolidated and refined.

<u>RE</u>

In RE the children will be completing the topic Pentecost - Serving: Witnesses and looking closely at the life work of Father Balashowry as an example of a modern day witnesss. We will also be studying Islam within our multi-faith week.

Maths

Year 6 will begin the term with revision of the maths topics covered throughout this year in preparation for the SATs assessments in May.

We will be revising and consolidating all areas of Maths from the main strands: Number, Geometry, Statistics and Measure. WE will also be completing daily arithmetic to improve our fluency and efficiency.

History

History will see us studying the early Islamic civilisation of Baghdad. We will look at the history of the city and the cultures and customs they had in AD 900.

We will consider the alphabet they wrote with, the rules they shared and the traditions they celebrated in Baghdad.

Reading

Reading is incredibly important this year. It will be an integral part of our English lessons, it will be taught through daily guided reading sessions and there is always time provided if the children choose to read for pleasure in school.

Art / DT

In art we will discuss how graffiti polarises opinion, identify distinctive features of graffiti art and consider where it is, and is not, appropriate to make graffiti art, as well as the messages it conveys to the wider community. We will sketch and develop designs for graffiti art.



Homework will take on a different format this term as we begin our UFA programme. Homework for Maths, Reading, Writing and SPaG will be given out on a Monday and completed for the following Monday's UFA session.

P.E.

Our PE lessons over the Summer term will be Athletics themed. We will take part in range of athletics events both indoors and outdoors. We will explore the many aspects of athletics including: running, jumping and throwing using a range of different distances and equipment.
