English

We will begin this half term by completing a Quest tale. Our literacy work this term will be influenced by our Hope and Refugee topic and will be heavily based around our class text-*Welcome to Nowhere* by Elizabeth Laird. We will imitate and innovate *a model text* then will invent our own. Children will describing settings, characters and atmosphere. We will also focus on using vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects and clarify meaning. After this, we will use our work around refugees to write letters/diary entries.

Reading

Reading is incredibly important this year. It will be an integral part of our English lessons and will also be taught through guided reading sessions. We always ensure there is time provided for the children to read for pleasure and would also like this to be encouraged daily at home.

SPAG

SPAG will be taught in both English lessons and weekly Basic Skills sessions. We will focus on a different skill and spelling pattern each week, as well as words from the statutory spelling list for UKS2. Spelling word lists and patterns will be shared on Seesaw for pupils to learn throughout the year.

R.E.

We begin with our Vocation and Commitment topic. We will understand how , all Christians share the mission of Jesus and will explore how there are many different ways of living out this mission. Our Advent topic will follow this and we will explore Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus, given by God as a sign and expression of God's love. Children will understand that advent is a time of joyful expectation, as we prepare to receive Jesus into our lives and to share this gift with others at Christmas and throughout the year.

Maths

We will start the term by continuing our work on written methods of multiplication and division. Then we will begin some statistics work. Children will read and interpret data from line graphs, timetables, tables and pie charts. In addition, we will construct pie charts and calculate the mean. Following this, we will start our work on fractions. Children will: compare and order fractions, identify equivalent fractions, recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions, add and subtract fractions and multiply and divide fractions. We will continually focus on developing our problem solving and reasoning skills during each unit.

Homework

This year, children will receive weekly Maths and English homework. Maths will be handed out on a Monday and is due back in on the Thursday and English will be handed out on a Thursday to be completed over the weekend.

Science

During our *Changes in Materials* unit we will give uses for, compare and group everyday materials on the basis of their properties. Children will understand that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution and will describe how to recover a substance from a solution. They will decide how mixtures might be separated and explore different irreversible and reversible changes.

Topic

This term children will complete a Geography topic, which will develop their locational knowledge. They must name and locate the main countries in the UK, Europe and North or South America. They will locate and name principal cities before comparing a rural/urban area of the UK Linking with History, compare land use maps of UK from past with the present, focusing on land use. We will use the current Refugee Crisis as a context for our learning.

Art & DT

This term we will link our Art work to work around the Refugee Crisis and hope. Children will explore the roles and purposes of artists, working in different cultures. They will develop their drawing skills by working from a variety of sources including observation, photographs and digital images. They will also work in a sustained and independent way to create a detailed drawing and develop close observation skills.

Computing

This term we will link our computing to our Hope and Refugee topics. During this unit the children will use Google apps for collaborative research, as well as planning and creating a group website. They will need to consider the design and consistency of the site.

P.E

This year we will have indoor PE on a Tuesday afternoon and outdoor PE will with Phil on a Thursday afternoon. This term the children will participate in team games, football, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending. They will master basic movements including running and jumping, as well as developing balance agility and co-ordination.

French
