Rose Gardens Gates must be locked at <u>9am promptly</u>.


This will mean that children will have to come around to the main entrance if they are late. Mr Thomas has to lock all the school gates and cannot be asked to bring children through. Sorry!

Charlie, Oliver, Grant and Emily were delighted to be presented with a medal for completing the Star Strike Football Training with Phil. Congratulations, everyone!






Amber was delighted to receive another rosette from the Stepney Banks stables for her riding.




Youth in the North East are most likely to say that 'thumbs up' is their favourite emoji selfies UK youth take


